Today's events at the Sublette County Fairgrounds highlight 4-H and FFA contests, with an all-day Junior Horse Show in its second day, FFA Exhibit judging, livestock check-in, and the popular Robotic Challenge in the Commercial Building. Supporting Sublette County youth is pretty much what Fair is all about.

Beginning Wednesday, youth and adults alike will find new carnival rides, state-of-the-art video games, an ATV safety simulator courtesy of the US Forest Service, a special movie stunt experience, and much more. Free camel rides and a petting zoo have been added to Fair entertainment July 27 – 30 as well. This replaces Wild About Monkeys, which is unable to appear.

It's even more fun if you participate! Although Open Class exhibit entries, such as quilts, crafts, preserves and flowers, are due Wednesday from 4 to 8 pm, there is still plenty of time to enter many

other open contests, such as the Dutch Oven Cookoff, Chocolate Dessert Bake-off, Pet Show, and the Talent Contest (shhhhh – don't tell anyone, but you get \$25 just for entering that one!).

The boot contest this year is designed to inspired creativity, following the Fair theme, "Roots & Boots." Bring anything with a "root" in any kind of "boot" to the Fair Office by Friday at 1 pm.

We've got a fantastic country music concert lined up for Friday night at 7 pm: Grammy Nominee Joe Nichols will pack the Ag Center with his down home hits. Tickets are just \$25 at the door, all seats, all ages.

Local musicians, including Jared Rogerson, V the Gypsy Cowgirl, Jason Burton, Mike Hurwitz and Terry Hill will take turns on the Deanne Bradley Stage, and will keep things lively at the Barn Dance on Thursday at 7 pm, and the Buyer's Appreciation Luncheon (open to all) on Saturday at Noon.

Speaking of food, you may bust a couple of buttons eating at Fair, between the luncheons, cookoffs, and vendors serving everything from fajitas to barbecued beef.

Don't forget: Fair ends on Saturday, so don't miss Sublette County and LaBarge Bred & Raised, the Round Robin, the Junior Livestock Sale, and the Horse Pull that day.
